GARDEN CLUB

IT'S BACK!! SPRING THAT IS. Nature awakens and gardeners become motivated. Even though March is a very unpredictable month there are things you can do.

- Remove last year's growth from perennial beds.
- Cut back ornamental grasses that were not done last fall.
- Begin weeding if the ground has thawed enough.
- Remove leaves, sticks and fallen tree limbs.
- Start your seeds indoors or in cold frames.
- Propagate houseplants and tender perennials that were brought indoors.
- Plant trees and shrubs if the ground is workable and not frozen.
- Prune the rose bushes.

The Garden Club gets going this month with our first meeting on March 8th at 10:30a.m. There is a lot to accomplish: changing décor from winter to spring, checking garden damage from winter, spring garden assignments, summer watering schedule, plant selections, checking supplies, updating inventory and brainstorming our goals.

Over the past 6 years, the Garden Club has selected and accomplished a yearly project or an event. This year will be the installation of the Butterfly Garden. And, speaking of butterflies, if you received milkweed seeds at the Save the Monarch presentation last November, now is the time to refrigerate them for 30 days. Then plant them in a sunny place and water for at least two weeks. Remember or mark where they are planted so you don't mistakenly pull them when weeding. By the end of May or early June you will, hopefully, have full grown milkweed. Just in time for the arrival of the Monarchs.

Have you thought about growing fresh, nutritious vegetables? You have no backyard or green space to grow your own food, say you? CONSIDER and PLAN NOW FOR CONTAINER GARDENING! It is an easy, enjoyable way

to grow any vegetable on a windowsill, patio, doorstep or any space with sufficient sunlight and ease of care.

When making the decision to container garden, think about the same things you would be thinking about when gardening on a piece of land: healthy soil, adequate sunlight, enough water, good fertilizer, thoughtful pest management, and, of course, the types of containers you will use.

Any container can be used: buckets, baskets, wooden boxes, ceramic, terra cotta or plastic pots – to name a few. Five-gallon buckets are suitable for summer squash, tomatoes, peppers, bush beans and eggplant. 2-gallon size for vegetables like swiss chard, broccoli, radishes, cabbage & cauliflower, 4-6" deep container for lettuce, spinach and herbs. Don't forget to put drainage holes in the bottom of the container, line them with newspaper or coffee filters (keeps dirt in) before putting in a standard potting soil, then place them on bricks or blocks to allow free drainage. Match the type of plant you grow to the size of the container – Big plant? Think big pot!

ATTENTION ALL LIONS HEAD SOUTH RESIDENTS

Due to an increase in reported violations, the Brick Township Police Department has advised they will begin to enforce the following violations in 2023, occurring in our community:

- * SPEEDING Monitoring of speeders began in January and all violators will be ticketed and fined (NJ State Law).
- * WRONG WAY PARKING Parked cars MUST face the direction of traffic (Brick Township Ordinance).
- * BLOCKING SIDEWALKS Vehicles CANNOT block the sidewalks (Brick Township Ordinance).
- * FIRE HYDRANT / STOP SIGN Parking too close to a fire hydrant or Stop Sign (Brick Township Ordinance).
- * CIGARETTE BUTTS Discarding cigarette butts on street or sidewalk this is considered LITTERING and you will be fined (Brick Township Ordinance).
- * DOG WASTE MUST be picked up and disposed of properly (Brick Township Ordinance).



PRIORITY FOR DRIVEWAY SNOW REMOVAL

As we approach another winter season, we again find it necessary to clarify who qualifies for the Priority Snow Removal list for 2022-2023 winter season. A new request is required every season.

For those who qualify, please submit your request to assure that you will be placed on the priority list. To qualify, a resident must require regular life-sustaining medical treatment, such as chemotherapy, radiation, or dialysis in or outside the home.

A "heart condition" does not qualify. Your request must be accompanied by a physician script/note which specifies that life-sustaining treatment for any of the conditions outlined above is necessary. Hand written notes are unacceptable. All information will be kept by the administrator and will be confidential.

For convenience purposes, your doctor may fax this information to our office. Our fax number is 732-920-2650. Please be assured this information will be kept strictly confidential. Placement on the Priority Snow List cannot be accomplished until we receive the necessary documentation from your physician.

Your need to go to work does not qualify for priority snow removal. For this purpose, we suggest you make advance arrangements with a private contractor for snow removal.

The township will cooperate by plowing our roads so that our contractor can begin work. Of course, the town will continue to respond to any serious problems during storms.

ALWAYS CALL 911 FOR ANY MEDICAL EMERGENCY

Please be sure to keep on hand extra supplies of medications and food so that you do not need to leave the house during or immediately after a snowstorm. The weather predications generally provide ample warning time for making preparations.

Please respond as soon as possible as the winter season will be here soon.


