The golf course provides us a go to place during the cold, dark winter months and if the weather permits, play some golf with our buddies and it can give us a chance to get out of the house.

The Starter Program has ended for the year, it was very successful, and we believe has greatly assisted in our membership growth. As we prepare for 2023, we will be signing up interested members to be Starters for the 2023 season. If you have any questions concerning this volunteer program, call me or stop by the LHCC Office. The Program will run from April through October, and we will need additional Starters for 2023. Your participation and support will assist our continued growth in membership and income.

At this time of the year the Board of Directors should already be setup for the new year. Unfortunately, we still require a minimum of one more Board member. This would be an opportune time for anyone interested in the operation of our course to get involved. We have a lot of experienced Board members and Advisors that can greatly assist in the learning curve for new members. The Board sets the tone and direction for the course, events, League play and the social functions of the golf membership. Joining the Board of Directors now would be ideal as this is the 5th year of our five-year plan to solidify the golf course operations, establish a paid position to provide the continuity necessary in any business. We have spent years working towards a more streamlined business-oriented operation and away

from our “Mom and Pop” operation. It is noted and accepted that we cannot achieve the stability we need to continue our current growth without some semblance of a permanent staff position. We will continue to pursue a paid staff position that will solve so many of these problems, pull our operations together and maintain the desired income and membership growth over the long haul.

As indicated in the October Pride, our tournament for 2022 was one of the best in a number of years. We will continue to put more time, effort, and money into future tournaments. For next year’s tournament we will continue with the Putting Contest as well as review the existing award structure for the closest to Pin and Line with the intent of increasing the amount of money awarded. This year’s income from the tournament exceeded our projected amount and we intend to do even better next year.

During October, Marcene Talty, our Event’s Director, sat in for me for the three weeks. I was out of town. Marcene did a great job and without a doubt would be a prime candidate to take over the job. I appreciate everything Marcene did and would hope at some point she would consider taking this position. We are very fortunate to have the multitude of qualified volunteers that are willing to do these necessary jobs to ensure our golf course is well run and organized for the benefit of all of us.

Our Reforestation Program began in earnest with the request to the Board of Trustees to authorize us to purchase 17 trees that were approved for the 2022 Capital Improvement Funds.

The plan is to concentrate on the area between Holes 4 and 5 on Ashford Dr this year and along Lions Head Blvd near Hole 2 in the Spring. Initial planting will be 10 Crepe Myrtle, 3 Dogwood and 4 Lilac Bushes.

The last Scramble of the year was held on Tuesday, November 8th. Results are posted to the LHS Web Site and the LHCC BB.

The Board of Directors Meeting was held after the Scramble on November 8th, and the minutes are on the LHS Web Site and the LHCC BB.

The last Event of the year for the LHCC is the Polar Bear Shootout. This is scheduled for Saturday, December 31st, starting at Noon. The Cost for the Shootout is \$2.00, and a light lunch will be provided as well as soda and water.

Our Welcome Committee at Lions Head South hosted a successful "Meet and Greet" on October 24th for new residents who moved into our community since April of 2022.



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SECURITY COMMITTEE

Decem"burr" is upon us and with it comes tips and suggestions to get through the holiday season safely.

Car safety - It is Important to winterize your car before the bad weather hits. This means having the wiper fluid, antifreeze, battery, tires, and windshield wipers checked and replaced if necessary. ALSO, clean snow off your car entirely so that you can drive safely and are not a hazard to others on the road - motorists who fail to do so face fines of \$25 to \$75 for each offense, regardless of whether the ice and snow is dislodged from the vehicle.

Remember your cell phone (and that it is fully charged) if you drive in bad weather, or just stay home! Always let someone know where you are going and when you should be expected back. If you need essential items, such as prescriptions or food (and ICE MELT) - get it ahead of time or perhaps you can ask a neighbor to make the trek for you - we are all in this together.

Home safety - Many people burn candles during the holiday - VERY IMPORTANT - make sure they are extinguished before you go out or to bed - SAFER is to buy the battery powered candles. Also, poinsettia plants are poisonous to pets so keep them away or buy fake ones - just as pretty and you can use them next year! While we all want to save on energy costs, be careful when lowering heat as you do not want your pipes to freeze. Just opening cabinet doors under kitchen and bathroom cabinets will allow pipes to stay warm enough to prevent a costly repair. IF you decide to venture out to shovel, do it a little at a time and take frequent breaks. **REMINDER:** Several types of rock salt are toxic to animals and should not be used on sidewalks where residents walk their pets so, please read the fine print when purchasing.

HOLIDAY SHOPPING CONCERNS - Many of us shop online for the holidays and packages are tempting for "porch thieves." Alerting neighbors that you are expecting deliveries can help prevent this. Also, keep an eye for people in unmarked vehicles running up empty handed to porches - taking off with gifts - jotting down a plate or at least a description of vehicle and then calling the non-emergency Brick Police telephone number, 732-262-1100, may not prevent that theft but could increase vigilance on their part. Also, if sending gift cards to family and friends as MANY never arrive for their recipients : (- send certified mail so it can be tracked, use Venmo, zelle or paypal money. Better yet, many companies (Visa included) offer online gift cards that can be emailed prior to the holiday (or the day of for those of us who shop last minute :P) and it will save you the headache of it getting lost or stolen.

Finally, best wishes for a happy, healthy and most importantly - safe holiday!







1 16 oz. pkg of buttermilk Pillsbury Grand Biscuits
2 cups 10X sugar (powdered sugar)
1 medium to large paper bag
4 tbsp. melted butter or 3 tbsp. of canola oil
1 cup raspberry jelly (seedless) - optional strawberry

1. Prepare a paper bag with the 10X sugar

GINGERBREAD BISCOTTI

Ingredients:

1/2 cup vegetable oil
1 tbsp baking powder
1 1/2 tbsp ground ginger
3/4 tbsp ground cinnamon
1 cup of sugar
1/2 tsp ground cloves
3 eggs
1/4 tbsp ground nutmeg
1/4 cup molasses
2 1/4 cup all-purpose flour
1 cup whole wheat flour

Directions:

1. Preheat oven to 375*
2. In a large bowl mix together oil, sugar, eggs, molasses.

In bowl #2 combine flours, baking powder, ginger, cinnamon, cloves, nutmeg ... mix into egg mixture to form a stiff dough.

3. Divide dough in half.& shape each into a roll similar to the shape of a biscotti. Place on cookie sheet & bake for 25 mins. Then cool & set aside.

4. After cooling ... slice diagonal into 1/2" thick biscotti cookies & place on a cookie sheet. 2nd BAKE each side 5-7 mins. until CRISPY!

OPTIONAL: MELT MINTED white chocolate & drizzle the cookies when cool.

- 1 cup orange juice
- 1/4 cup lemon juice
- 1/4 cup water
- 1 tbsp butter
- 1 tsp orange peel
- 1/2 tsp lemon peel

Directions:

1. Prepare & bake the cake mix directions provided on box. Cool & slice each cake in half, making 4 layers.
2. Make the citrus filling
In a saucepan bring to a boil the 1st 6 ingredients - for citrus filling.
Remove from heat & add last 3 ingredients. Refrigerate & cool.
3. Separate the sliced fruit into 4 bowls ... 1 cup ea.
4. Divide citrus into 4 equal parts & toss into each cup of sliced fruit.
5. Place bottom layer of cake on a serving plate & spread 1 cup of sliced fruit on the layer.
6. Repeat on next 3 layers. OPTIONAL - the top layer can be dressed with a layer of whipped cream! Refrigerate before serving.

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PRIORITY FOR DRIVEWAY SNOW REMOVAL

As we approach another winter season, we again find it necessary to clarify who qualifies for the Priority Snow Removal list for 2022-2023 winter season. A new request is required every season.

For those who qualify, please submit your request to assure that you will be placed on the priority list. To qualify, a resident must require regular life-sustaining medical treatment, such as chemotherapy, radiation, or dialysis in or outside the home.

A "heart condition" does not qualify. Your request must be accompanied by a **physician script/note** which specifies that life-sustaining treatment for any of the conditions outlined above is necessary. Hand written notes are unacceptable. All information will be kept by the administrator and will be confidential.

For convenience purposes, your doctor may fax this information to our office. Our fax number is 732-920-2650. Please be assured this information will be kept strictly confidential. Placement on the Priority Snow List cannot be accomplished until we receive the necessary documentation from your physician.

Your need to go to work does not qualify for priority snow removal. For this purpose, we suggest you make advance arrangements with a private contractor for snow removal.


The township will cooperate by plowing our roads so that our contractor can begin work. Of course, the town will continue to respond to any serious problems during storms.

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KIRMS PHOTOGRAPHY Holiday Images

It's time to prepare for the holidays - Christmas, Hanukkah, and New Years. The main subjects are family and friends. I run this article every December because I think this is a good time for a review.

For candid shots make certain you're prepared -- have your camera ready and watch the subject for the expression you want. If you aren't ready the shot will be gone before you press the shutter. Most holiday shots will be taken indoors so don't forget to use your camera's flash.

For portraits and group shots get yourself set up first, and then prepare your subject. If you keep them waiting you will not get a natural relaxed image. For portraits choose a background that's festive, but not too busy. Have your subject(s) turn their shoulders slightly so they are not too square to the camera.

When photographing grandchildren or pets try to get eye level with them, rather than shooting down at them.

I also like to photograph the festive holiday decorations. These often make fun shots and they can be used on your holiday cards next year.

Don't forget the rule of thirds (also from a previous photo tip). Rather than placing your subjects in front of the

Christmas tree, move them slightly to one side. If shooting the dinner table set for the holiday feast, have the host stand at one side of the table about 1/3 of the way from the end, rather than centered at the end of the table.

These techniques will help improve your holiday images. Have a great holiday season, a happy and healthy New Year and remember to have fun with your camera.
