# **GARDEN CLUB**

As I am writing this, I am remembering the first few weeks of December with temperatures mostly in the 40s. But now, after 2 days of rain, the temperature has seriously dropped to the teens. Would love to see 40s again. February can be frigid, but as cold as it can get, it is still that much closer to spring. As the hours of daylight slowly increase, we can look forward to digging and planting again. Some past hints to remember:

- Keep those seed and nursery catalogues nearby and enjoy the planning of your next garden. Look for plants with improved insect, disease, and drought tolerance. Selecting native plants can be helpful also. Order them now to be ready when the ground thaws. Several herbs can be started indoors to get a head start.
- If you received an Amaryllis for the holidays, chances are the bloom is already a memory. Remove spent flowers and set the plant in a sunny window to allow the leaves to fully develop. Keep the soil evenly moist not soggy. Fertilize occasionally.
- For your poinsettia, if you've managed to keep it alive till now, give it at least 6 hours of good light. Be careful not to over or under water. Check often. When nights are at least 55 degrees, it can be planted outdoors where is will continue as a lovely shrub-like plant.

#### Some additional February Hints:

- Be careful using chemicals for icy pathways. Sand is a better replacement
- Continue to inspect indoor plants for insects
- Start to fertilize houseplants on a regular basis with a water-soluble fertilizer prepared at half strength until growth is healthy
- Remove diseased or damaged limbs from trees and shrubs
- Bring Spring into your home a little early with branches of forsythia and pussy willow.



• Most of all, be careful of icy walkways while walking outdoors

#### Monarch butterfly update:

Remember the milkweed seeds you received at our presentation? If you didn't plant them outdoors in the fall, now is the time to refrigerate them, so they will be ready to plant in March. Milkweeds require cold treatment before sprouting. Place seeds into a container of moist soil, cover with a plastic bag, and refrigerate for a least three weeks. Transplant seedlings to a sizable container and grow inside for about 6 weeks or until outdoor temps have warmed. Keep moist but not soggy. When plants have two sets of leaves transplant to permanent location. Questions? Call Mel Ferraro or Lucy Coburn.

• Remember to plant colorful flowers to attract pollinators to your garden.

One final note on the Holiday Luncheon hosted by Shorrock Gardens for the LHCC and WGA in December. This event followed the WGA Ladies baking and delivery to Shorrock 65 dozen cookies for their patients over the holidays. This traditional Holiday luncheon was set up and coordinated by Ken Winne several years ago and has been an annual event except during the Covid period. Ken and his wife Eileen have been instrumental in introducing Shorrock to our golfing community and over the years they have provided lunches for our monthly scramble. Ken's efforts in this area have gone a long way in securing the support of Shorrock for so many of our events, including the scrambles, Romano fund raising BBQ and our Annual Tournament. Shorrock provided the funding and prizes for the Putting Contest and also provided 100 "goodie bags" that are given to tournament participants. We appreciate the support provided and look forward to continued efforts to maintain and improve the condition of the course to ensure it is one of the best in the area. As always, we ask the residents, golfers and non-golfers alike, to recommend our course to any and all golfers you may come in contact with. 



# **SECURITY COMMITTEE**

As winter is in full swing and we are spending more time in our homes, a few suggestions to stay injury free:

- If you have difficulty with walking or balance, or have fallen in the past year, talk to your doctor about having a special falls risk assessment. Ask them if you would benefit from an exercise program to prevent falls.
- If you have fallen before, or are scared of falling, think about buying a special alarm that you wear as a bracelet or necklace. Then, if you fall and can't get to the phone, you can push a button on the alarm that will call emergency services for you.
- Don't rush to answer the phone. Many people fall trying to answer the phone. Either carry a cordless or cell phone or let an answering machine pick up.
- When walking on smooth floors, wear non-slip footwear, such as slippers with rubber/no-slip bottoms or flat, thin-soled shoes that fit well.
- If you have a cane or a walker, use it at all times instead of holding onto walls and furniture.
- Make sure lighting is good and keep cords away from where you walk.
- Don't get on step stools to reach an item ask a neighbor or friend to retrieve it for you.
- By following these simple tips you can stay healthy and injury free!
- Miscellaneous security/safety GENTLE REMINDERS that apply to residents and visitors alike:
- Dogs MUST BE ON A LEASH and dog waste MUST be picked up and disposed of properly (Town ordinance)
- Cigarette butts are considered litter and need to be disposed of properly (Town ordinance)
- Vehicles CANNOT block sidewalks (Town ordinance)
- Vehicles need to be parked faced in the direction of traffic (Town ordinance)
- No parking of vehicles on lawns (Community Rules/ Regulations)
- Visitors/guests are NOT allowed to use Fitness Room
   it is for RESIDENTS ONLY (Community Rules/ Regulations)
- PLEASE be careful backing out of driveways if your view is obstructed due to a parked car or snow get someone to check roadway before putting car in reverse or better yet, back car into driveway so your view is clear when pulling into roadway. If you SEE something SAY something the non-emergency # is 732-262-1100.

# **PRIORITY FOR DRIVEWAY SNOW REMOVAL**

As we approach another winter season, we again find it necessary to clarify who qualifies for the Priority Snow Removal list for 2022-2023 winter season. A new request is required every season.

For those who qualify, please submit your request to assure that you will be placed on the priority list. To qualify, a resident must require regular life-sustaining medical treatment, such as chemotherapy, radiation, or dialysis in or outside the home.

A "heart condition" does not qualify. Your request must be accompanied by a **physician script/note** which specifies that life-sustaining treatment for any of the conditions outlined above is necessary. Hand written notes are unacceptable. All information will be kept by the administrator and will be confidential.

For convenience purposes, your doctor may fax this information to our office. Our fax number is 732-920-2650. Please be assured this information will be kept strictly confidential. Placement on the Priority Snow List cannot be accomplished until we receive the necessary documentation from your physician. Your need to go to work does not qualify for priority snow removal. For this purpose, we suggest you make advance arrangements with a private contractor for snow removal.

The township will cooperate by plowing our roads so that our contractor can begin work. Of course, the town will continue to respond to any serious problems during storms.

#### <u>ALWAYS CALL</u> 911 FOR ANY MEDICAL EMERGENCY

Please be sure to keep on hand extra supplies of medications and food so that you do not need to leave the house during or immediately after a snowstorm. The weather predications generally provide ample warning time for making preparations.

Please respond as soon as possible as the winter season will be here soon.

If it's too cold out for you, then it's too cold out for your pet! Keep potty breaks quick & make sure to always monitor them while outside.



If you've been reading my articles each month you know my favorite subject is nature. Many animals are not as active in the cold months, and many birds leave the area and go south. There are other birds that migrate here from the northern reaches to escape the ultra harsh winters there. This gives us the opportunity to photograph different species. Unfortunately they are not as colorful in the winter plumage, but it's still a nice challenge to find them.

I especially like to find the different ducks and shore birds that arrive in winter. They are generally found in the inlets and around the jetties. Some are quite difficult to reach, but others can be found along roadways and parking lots near rivers.

A long lens is very helpful. Make certain to focus carefully and have the proper exposure. Fast shutter speeds will help keep them sharp if they are moving in the waves. It is not an easy shoot, but can yield great results.
