

ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE

Margaret DeFillipo

Happy Fall.....

The Architectural Committee will begin their fall walks during the months of October and November. The rear patio and sides of your home cannot be used as a storage area.

Architectural Applications are to be submitted when you are having work done on the exterior of your home.

Applications shall be submitted no later than <u>seven</u> (7) <u>business days</u> before the monthly meeting. Action on applications is usually completed by the tenth of each month. Approved applications shall <u>expire</u> at the end of the calendar year submitted, after which a new application shall be required.

No work shall commence on your home until your Architectural Application is approved and you pick up your permit to display in your front window.

Prior to removing or cutting trees in the Green Area/ Buffer Zone, a Tree Application must be submitted and approved by the Architectural Committee.

Per Architectural Regulations Page 2 III. GREEN AREAS

Green areas shall include those sections of property

to the rear or side boundaries owned by the unit owner and containing trees and/or other vegetation that were preserved and/or planted by the developer. Green areas shall be left in a natural state. Trimming shall be the unit owners' responsibility.

No trees or shrubs shall be removed from the Green Areas without the approval of the Architectural Committee, which shall include an on-site inspection and consultation. If overgrown trees/shrubs are removed, and if deemed necessary to preserve the Green Areas, and to maintain a privacy screen, as before, suitable replacement evergreen shrubs or small trees shall be required.

Adjacent neighbors affected by the changes shall be notified before work is started.

Patios, poured concrete, picnic tables, barbecues and firewood shall not be placed in the Green Areas. This list is not all-inclusive.

Regular and Emergency Maintenance in the Green Areas

Therefore, to protect the privacy capabilities of the Green Areas and the rights of the adjacent neighbors, the following regulations will apply:

- All work in a Green Area must be approved in advance.
- Their quest package must include a detailed plan of what will be done.
- A list of the signatures of all affected property owners must be attached to their quest package.

At this writing, the Garden Club has removed or relocated our summer plantings. Have you noticed that most of the shrubs alongside the back wall of the Clubhouse have been removed? With the cooperation of the Trustees and the Building and Grounds Committee, the Garden Club has taken on this project to replace/refresh old and decaying shrubs from this area. Most of these shrubs were planted when the community was new and they have not aged well. Diane Chapin has been the spark that got this effort in positive motion. Thank you Diane for all your hard work. While we will not be replacing plants till the pool area is completed, she and her committee are busy making plans and finding suitable replacements.

A reminder of the importance of being aware of the danger the Lantern fly presents to our forests and woodlands. When found, they should be captured and destroyed. Egg-laying takes place September through November. Please take note of information on the Lantern Fly and other subjects of interest on our bulletin board. Our thanks to Lucy Coburn for keeping our bulletin board current and informative.

TIPS FOR OCTOBER - Worth mentioning again

- Clean out gardens to discourage disease and pests from over wintering.
- Divide lilies.
- Clean out birdbaths, feeders and houses.
- Fertilize indoor plants and outdoor-grown chrysanthemums.
- Tulips are best planted in the fall. Grouping colors will give the best show.
- Tropical plants from your deck and patio have no frost tolerance and must be brought indoors. Do this gradually for them to adjust to the light change and check for insects. Treat accordingly.

FUN GARDENING FACTS

- The world's largest flower is the Rafflesia arnoldii. It can grow up to 3 feet in diameter and weigh up to 15 pounds—can't imagine a bouquet of these!
- The tallest tree in the world is a coast redwood named Hyperion. It stands at 379.7 feet tall.

- The Venus Flytrap is native to only one place on Earth: the wetlands within a 60-mile radius of Wilmington, North Carolina.
- The largest seed in the world comes from the Coco de mer palm tree. It can weigh up to 66 pounds or almost the same as 100 cans of beer.
- Bamboo is the tallest grass in the world. It can grow up to 91 feet tall.
- What do Vanilla and Corn have in common? Vanilla flavoring comes from the pod of an orchid, Vanilla planifolia. Though the pods are called vanilla beans, they're more closely related to corn than green beans. The world of gardening is full of fun and mystery.

SECURITY COMMITTEE

Happy Fall! Just a few reminders from Brick PD Safety Officer Thergersen and Neighborhood Watch Liaison Officer Finelli who were our guest speakers at the August Resident's meeting:

*Project Safe Lock: Brick Township Police are reminding residents about a program that allows emergency access for first responders when time is of the essence. The program is voluntary and has restrictions as to who can participate. Brick Township Police issue lock boxes on a case-by-case basis, evaluating factors such as the living arrangements, the age of the person, their physical conditions and medical status. Access to information about the lock boxes is limited for use only in situations such as a medical emergency where the person is unable to get to the door and unlock it.

There are application forms located in the "nurses office" in the clubhouse or you can obtain one online at the Brick Police website under "Forms," or pick one up at the Community Policing Office at the Brick Township Police Department during regular business hours. Using this program can prevent costly repairs in the event emergency personnel have to break into your home to administer medical treatment.

Even if YOU don't need the lockbox, perhaps you know a neighbor who might benefit from this program and you could help them complete forms (

*Garage doors and garage windows: Lock your car DAILY and SET ALARM as crooks could break in and use your garage door opener to access your home. If you don't have a garage door opener, ensure your door and any garage windows are locked as well. Better yet, keep the door locked between the garage and your home as an added layer of protection.

For our friends that head south for the winter, it is suggested to tell a trusted neighbor or friend to keep a watchful eye on your home. Not only for security reasons but broken pipes in the freezing temperatures will cause extensive damage if undetected until spring.

Finally, be careful with what you post on social media as crooks are very clever in their pursuit of unlawful actions. IF YOU SEE SOMETHING - SAY SOMETHING and keep police non-emergency #732-262-1100 in your phone.

Simple Cherry Tomato Pasta - Use end of the season cherry tomatoes. This light, easy PASTA recipe for a **OUICK** weeknight dinner!

Ingredients:

3 cups cherry tomatoes

4 - 5 cloves garlic (finely chopped)

1/2 cup xtra virgin OO

1 tbsp Italian seasoning

1 cup fresh basil

Architectural Regulations Revisions

Please Tear out and Place in the Lions Head South **Architectural Regulations**

Page 1, II. Restrictions on Common Property Uses Page 14, XV. Exterior Storage of Trash or Supplies

Recommendations presented by the Architectural Committee to include additions/revisions to Restrictions on Common Property Uses and Exterior Storage of Trash or Supplies.

Motion approved by the Board of Trustees August 28, 2023.

Please Note Additional Revision to Page 1, II, Restrictions on Common Ground, Paragraph 7, To Read as Follows:

Vegetable gardens shall be limited to the three-foot wide rear foundation planting area of the house or side from the rear of the air conditioning unit to the rear of the house or an equivalent area on the opposite side of the house. Tree plantings may be protected with green vinyl coated landscaping type fencing, specifically designed to protect plants. It may be placed around new plantings, during their first year of planting. It may not exceed three (3) feet in height and must be removed by May 1 of the year following the planting. No chicken wire or construction fencing may be used.

Lions Head South Architectural Regulations Page 14, XV. Exterior Storage of Trash or Supplies/Storage Containers/Garbage Collection Replaces 2nd Paragraph:

One (1) small deck box, no larger than six (6) feet in length, thirty-six (36) inches in height and thirty-six (36) inches deep, with a top hinged lid only, may be placed behind the air conditioner on either side of the house, but not on the street side if a corner property. It may also be placed on the rear patio at the rear of the house. In addition, one (1) upright storage/garden container, measuring no larger than six (6) feet in height, three (3) feet wide and two (2) feet deep may be stored on the rear patio. A maximum of two (2) units (one of each) maybe placed on each property. The storage units may not be made of wood and must be constructed of man-made materials. It must be stand-alone and may not be attached to the house. The color must blend in with the existing color of the house. Prior approval of the size, color and location of the storage unit (s) is required by the Architectural Committee.

PRIORITY FOR DRIVEWAY SNOW REMOVAL

As we approach another winter season, we again find it necessary to clarify who qualifies for the Priority Snow Removal list for 2023-2024 winter season. A new request is required every season.

For those who qualify, please submit your request to assure that you will be placed on the priority list. To qualify, a resident must require regular life-sustaining medical treatment, such as chemotherapy, radiation, or dialysis in or outside the home.

A "heart condition" does not qualify. Your request must be accompanied by a **physician script/note** which specifies that life-sustaining treatment for any of the conditions outlined above is necessary. Hand written notes are unacceptable. All information will be kept by the administrator and will be confidential.

For convenience purposes, your doctor may fax this information to our office. Our fax number is 732-920-2650. Please be assured this information will be kept strictly confidential. Placement on the Priority Snow List cannot be accomplished until we receive the necessary documentation from your physician.

Your need to go to work does not qualify for priority snow removal. For this purpose, we suggest you make advance arrangements with a private contractor for snow removal.
